



The Cook Islands border is open to New Zealand from 14 January 2022
with no quarantine in either country!

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

COVID-19 TEST REQUIRED PRIOR TO DEPARTURE

All travellers will need to provide a negative Covid-19 test taken no more than 72 hours prior to departure to the Cook Islands. You must have been in New Zealand no less than 14 days prior to your departure.

ALL VISITORS MUST BE 12+ AND FULLY VACCINATED

All visitors must be aged 12 years and over and must be fully vaccinated or provide a certified medical exemption. No exceptions. Children under 12 years of age will be permitted to enter the Cook Islands once children between 5-11 years of age in New Zealand have begun being vaccinated.

COOK ISLANDS CONTACT FORM MUST BE SUBMITTED PRIOR TO TRAVEL

You must complete [this Cook Islands contact form NO MORE THAN 72 hours prior to your departure from NZ. You must also complete the Nau Mai Rā form](#) It is recommended you complete this before departing New Zealand

EVERYONE MUST USE COOKSAFE CONTACT TRACING

The CookSafe and the CookSafe+ App are mandatory for everyone to use in the Cook Islands.

This travel corridor is only open between New Zealand and the Cook Islands. The maritime border remains closed. You will not be required to quarantine or self isolate in the Cook Islands OR on your return to New Zealand.
